 - Do we know what the impact of federal cuts are and/or will be? Any sense of same?

 - A committee member talked about the Carlin Smith Act that was recently passed and stated, I want to make sure we are on board with the new law.
 - The Carlton R. Smith Jr. HIV Modernization Act (often referred to as the "Carlin Smith Act" or Carlton Smith Act") in Maryland is a landmark piece of legislation that repealed the state's outdated HIV criminalization laws.
 - When it comes to <u>economic mobility</u>, we need to look more into the LGBTQ community!
