## AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Sale of Property – 2 Parcels of Land Known as "Canal Parcel" and
"Lot 3", Located in Ward 03, Section 7, Block 1816

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in (1) a parcel of land known as "Canal Parcel", located in Ward 03, Section 07, Block 1816, consisting of approximately 0.317 acres of land, and (2) a parcel of land known as "Lot 3", located in Ward 03, Section 7, Block 1816, a portion of Lots 002 and 003, consisting of approximately 0.149 acres, and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

**SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That, in accordance with Article V, § 5(b) of the City Charter, the City Comptroller may sell, at either public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in (1) a parcel of land known as "Canal Parcel", located in Ward 03, Section 07, Block 1816, consisting of approximately 0.317 acres of land, and (2) a parcel of land known as "Lot 3", located in Ward 03, Section 7, Block 1816, a portion of Lots 002 and 003, consisting of approximately 0.149 acres, as shown on a subdivision plat prepared by Bowman Consulting, dated June 23, 2010, and more particularly described as follows:
