By adding Article 20 - Railroads Section(s) 8-1 through 8-10, to be under the new subtitle, "Subtitle 8. Rail Transport of Crude Oil" Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000) SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows: **Baltimore City Code** Article 20. Railroads SUBTITLE 8. RAIL TRANSPORT OF CRUDE OIL

26 27 28	THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL CREATE A MECHANISM TO ENSURE PROPER CLEAN UP AND EFFECTIVE RESPONSE IN THE EVENT OF A DERAILMENT OR ANY OTHER ADVERSE HEALTH OR SAFETY IMPACT THAT RESULTS FROM EXPOSURE TO CRUDE OIL SHIPMENTS.
