**INTRODUCTION** – City Streets - Closing - Inloes Alley and Two Three-Foot Alleys Bounded by Tyson Street, Wilson Alley, Park Avenue, and Mulberry Street

**PURPOSE/PLANS** – For the purpose of condemning and closing Inloes Alley and two three-foot alleys bounded by Tyson Street, Wilson Alley, Park Avenue, and Mulberry Street, as shown on Plat 303-A-18A in the Office of the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special effective date.

**COMMENTS** – Council Bill 20-0499 serves as a companion piece of legislation to Council Bill 20-0498 and Council Bill 20-0500. Collectively the bills help to consolidate adjacent properties into a larger developable parcel. The larger parcel will likely be redeveloped into a mixed-use property involving a blend of new-construction and restoration of existing historical buildings.

**AGENCY/DEPARTMENT POSITION** – The Department of Transportation currently foresees no direct fiscal nor operational impact resulting from the advancement of Council Bill 20-0499. The Department of Transportation **supports** the advancement of City Council Bill 20-0499.
