AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Baltimore City Commission for Women – Non-Voting Members

FOR the purpose of allowing the Mayor to appoint ~~members of the Baltimore City Council~~ certain elected officials from Baltimore City as additional, non-voting members of the Baltimore City Commission for Women; conforming related provisions; providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to the Baltimore City Commission for Women.

BY repealing, and reordaining, with amendments

Article 1 - Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 1. Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies

Subtitle 20. Baltimore City Commission for Women

§ 20-1. Commission established.

(b) *Composition.*

(1) The Commission comprises 19 VOTING members, to be appointed by the Mayor in accordance with Article IV, § 6 of the City Charter.

(2) THE MAYOR MAY APPOINT 1 OR MORE MEMBERS OF THE BALTIMORE CITY COUNCIL OR THE BALTIMORE CITY DELEGATION TO THE MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY AS ADDITIONAL, NON-VOTING MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.

Underlining indicates matter added to the bill by amendment.

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1 **§ 20-4. Meetings; quorum.**

2 (a) *In general.*

3 (1) The Commission shall meet at the call of the Chair as frequently as required to
4 perform its duties.

5 (2) A majority of the VOTING members of the Commission constitutes a quorum for the
6 transaction of business.

7 (3) An affirmative vote by the majority of a quorum is needed for any official action.

8 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
9 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
10 Ordinance.

11 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
12 enacted.
