AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Baltimore City Landmark List – Johnny Eck House

FOR the purpose of designating the Johnny Eck House, 622 North Milton Avenue, as a historical landmark.

BY adding
Article 6 - Historical and Architectural Preservation
Section(s) 12-20
Baltimore City Code
(Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation

Subtitle 12. Landmark List 2000s

§ 12-20. JOHNNY ECK HOUSE.

JOHNNY ECK HOUSE, 622 NORTH MILTON AVENUE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
