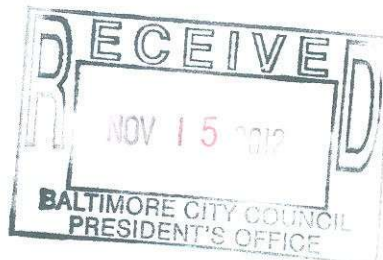
Re: City Council Bill 12-0143 – Zoning – Conditional Use Nonprofit Home  
for Homeless Women and Children – 1114 North Mount Street

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 12-043 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill permits, subject to certain conditions, the establishment, maintenance, and operation of a nonprofit home for homeless women and children on the property known as 1114 North Mount Street.

The subject property is zoned R-8 (General Residence District). The conditional uses that require the enactment of an ordinance in an R-8 zone are the same as in an R-7 zone. City Zoning Code (“ZG”) § 4-1104. The conditional uses that require the enactment of an ordinance in an R-7 zone include nonprofit homes for the care and custody of homeless persons. ZG § 4-1004. Thus, the passage of this bill is required before the property can be used as intended.

Pursuant to the City Zoning Code, a bill concerning a conditional use is classified as a “legislative authorization.” ZC § 16-101. Legislative authorizations require that certain procedures be followed in the bill’s passage. Specifically, certain notice requirements apply to the introduction of the bill. *See* ZC § 16-203. The bill must be referred to certain City agencies, which are obligated to review the bill in a specified manner. *See* ZC §§ 16-301, 16-302 & 16-304. Additional public notice and hearing requirements also apply to the bill. *See* ZC § 16-402. Finally, certain limitations on the City Council’s ability to amend the bill apply. *See* ZC § 16-403.



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Assuming all the procedural requirements are met, the Law Department will approve the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
