SITE/GENERAL AREA

Site Conditions: This property is located in Tuscany-Canterbury neighborhood in northern Baltimore. The bridge is directly accessed by Linkwood Road to the north and West University Parkway to the south.

General Area: The footbridge is directly east of 500 West University Parkway. The bridge is set in a residential area surrounded by apartments and detached single family homes.

HISTORY

There are no previous Planning Commission actions regarding this site.

ANALYSIS

This 120' metal bridge was completed in 2017 and spans the Stony Run. It follows the former Maryland and Pennsylvania Railroad lines and connects several miles of trail to make up the Stony Run walking path.

Amy Mickel, now deceased, was the younger sister of State Delegate Maggie McIntosh. Delegate McIntosh, who lives in the Tuscany-Canterbury neighborhood where the bridge is located, was able to secure funding for construction of the bridge. Amy Mickel came every day to Delegate McIntosh's home on Cloverill Road to walk Maggie's dogs and walked them to this bridge, from construction to completion, because she loved the bridge and its environment. One day when Maggie came home, she found Amy had passed while sitting down in the living room

after that day's walk. Delegate McIntosh and her family asked the local neighbors who led the bridge effort if they might dedicate the bridge as a memorial to Amy's life.


For these reasons, staff recommends approval of City Council Bill #18-0253.

Notification: Planning staff notified the Friends of Stony Run, the Roland Park Community Foundation, and Councilwoman Mary Pat Clarke.

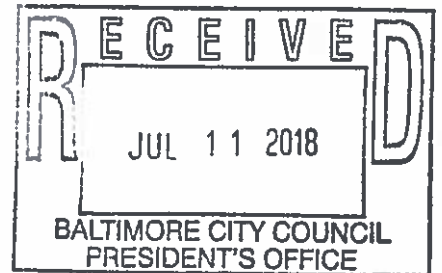

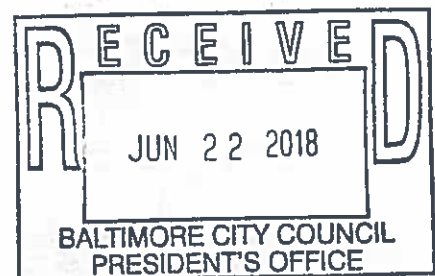

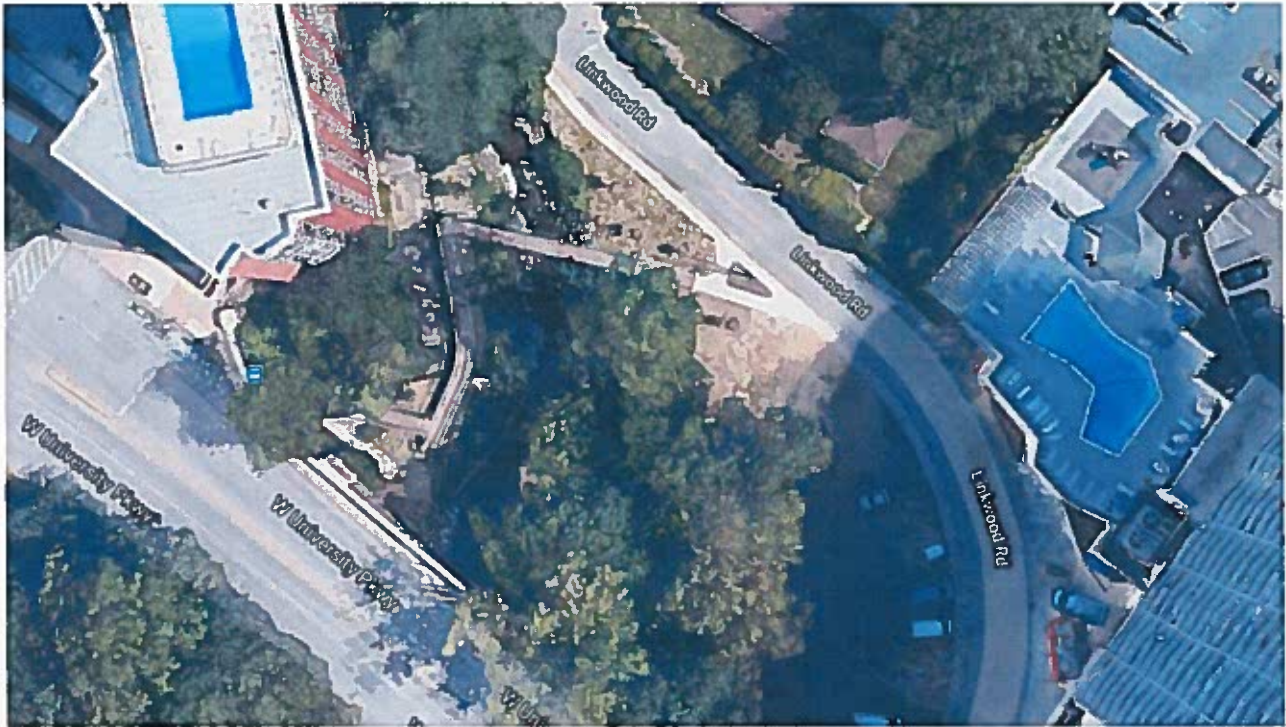
Current Law
