Re: City Council Bill 15-0236R- No Residential Water Shut-Offs Until Delinquent Commercial Accounts are Addressed

Dear Madame President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 15-0236R for form and legal sufficiency. This resolution is for the purpose of calling on the Department of Public Works to halt water shut-off efforts directed against residential accounts owing hundreds of dollars each until it has collected from, or shut-off water to, the commercial accounts that owe the City millions in unpaid water bills.

In general, a City Council resolution is "an expression of opinion or mind concerning some particular item of business coming within the legislative body's official cognizance." Inlet Assocs. v. Assateague House Condominium Assoc., 545 A.2d 1296, 1303 (Md. 1988) (quoting McQuillin Mun. Corp. § 15:2 (3<sup>rd</sup> Ed.)). Council Bill 15-0200R is an appropriate resolution to express the Council's concerns about this particular situation and request information from City agencies.

The Law Department approves Council Bill 15-236R for form and legal sufficiency as consistent with the City Council's authority to express its views on this matter.
