## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning City Streets - Opening -2 **Hunter Street** 3 FOR the purpose of condemning and opening Hunter Street, extending from the north side of a 4 10-foot alley, laid out in the rear of the properties known as 210 through 218/220-222 East 5 Preston Street, Northerly 94.1 feet, more or less, to the south side of a 7-foot alley, laid out in 6 the rear of the properties known as 209 through 217 East Mount Royal Avenue, as shown on 7 Plat 338-A-21 in the Office of the Department of Public Works; and providing for a special 8 effective date. 9 By authority of 10 Article I - General Provisions 11 Section 4 12 and 13 Article II - General Powers 14 15 Sections 2, 34, and 35 **Baltimore City Charter** 16 (1996 Edition) 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 18 Department of Public Works shall proceed to condemn and open Hunter Street, extending from 19 the north side of a 10-foot alley, laid out in the rear of the properties known as 210 through 20 218/220-222 East Preston Street, Northerly 94.1 feet, more or less, to the south side of a 7-foot 21 22 alley, laid out in the rear of the properties known as 209 through 217 East Mount Royal Avenue, and more particularly described as follows: 23 Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the east side 24 of Hunter Street, 20 feet wide, and the north side of a 10-foot alley, laid out in the 25 rear of the properties known as Nos. 210 through 218/220-222 E. Preston Street, 2.6 said point of beginning being distant, Westerly 173.8 feet, more or less, measured 27 along the north side of said 10-foot alley, from the west side of Guilford Avenue, 28 varying in width, and running thence binding on the line of the north side of said 29

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1	10-foot alley, if projected westerly, Westerly 20.00 feet, to intersect the west side
2	of said Hunter Street; thence binding on the west side of said Hunter Street,
3	Northerly 94.1 feet, more or less, to intersect the line of the south side of a 7-foot
4	alley, if projected easterly, laid out in the rear of the properties known as Nos. 209
5	through 217 E. Mount Royal Avenue; thence binding on the line of the south side
5	of said 7-foot alley, so projected, Easterly 20.00 feet, to intersect the east side of
7	said Hunter Street, and thence binding on the east side of said Hunter Street,
3	Southerly 94.1 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the proceedings for the condemnation and 11 opening of Hunter Street and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in 12 accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and 13 regulations adopted by the Director of Public Works and filed with the Department of 14 Legislative Reference. 15
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it 16 is enacted.

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
