15 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the
16 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Subtitle 10. Residential Permit Parking Program

Part III. Area Participation

§ 10-11. Participating areas.

(a) *In general.*

Except as otherwise provided in this section, participation in the Program is available to the following areas:

- (1) the “Pimlico Race Track Area”, as described in § 10-33 of this subtitle;
- (2) the “Little Italy Area”, as described in § 10-34 of this subtitle;
- (3) the “Fells Point Area”, as described in § 10-35 of this subtitle;
- (4) the “Cross Street Area”, as described in § 10-36 of this subtitle;
- (5) the “Camden Yards Stadium Complex Area”, as described in § 10-37 of this subtitle;
- (6) the “Guilford Area”, as described in § 10-38 of this subtitle; [and]
- (7) THE “BRUNT STREET AREA”, AS DESCRIBED IN § 10-39 OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND
- (8) [(7)] all other residential areas of the City that qualify under this subtitle.

Part VI. Statutory Areas

§ 10-39. BRUNT STREET AREA.

(A) *AREA DELINEATED.*

(1) *IN GENERAL.*

THE BRUNT STREET AREA IS THE AREA BOUNDED BY THE OUTER LIMITS OF THE 2100 BLOCK OF BRUNT STREET.

(2) *PARTICIPATING BLOCK FACES.*

THE BRUNT STREET AREA CONSISTS OF THE 2100 BLOCK OF BRUNT STREET, ~~ODD SIDE ONLY.~~ STREET.

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1 (B) *PARKING RESTRICTIONS.*

2 (1) *IN GENERAL.*

3 EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, PARKING
4 FOR NON-PERMIT HOLDERS IN AREA ____ IS LIMITED TO 2 HOURS IN ANY 1 OR MORE
5 PARKING SPOTS MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, FROM 7:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M.

6 (2) *ADDITIONAL RESTRICTION.*

7 IN ADDITION TO THE RESTRICTIONS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION,
8 PARKING FOR NON-PERMIT HOLDERS IS PROHIBITED SATURDAY AND SUNDAY.

9 (C) *PERMIT LIMITS.*

10 EACH DWELLING UNIT WITHIN AREA ____ IS ELIGIBLE FOR:

11 (1) UP TO 4 RESIDENT PERMITS; AND

12 (2) UP TO 2 VISITOR PERMITS.

13 (D) *SIGNAGE.*

14 RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT RESTRICTING SIGNAGE WILL BE PLACED ALONG ALL
15 PROPERTIES ON THE ODD SIDE OF THE 2100 BLOCK THAT ARE PERMIT-ELIGIBLE, WITH THE
16 EXCLUSION OF SCHOOLS, CHURCHES, AND BUSINESSES.

17 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day
18 after the date it is enacted.
