I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 11-0646 introduced by the Council President on behalf of the Administration (Department of Housing and Community Development).

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the Urban Renewal Plan for Oliver to reauthorize the acquisition of properties within the Project Area, to correct and clarify certain language, and to extend the life of the Plan; to waive certain content and procedural requirements; make the provisions of this Ordinance severable; and provide for the application of this Ordinance in conjunction with certain other ordinances.

The Urban Renewal Plan for Oliver was originally approved by Ordinance 71-1067 and was last amended by Ordinance 02-458. This urban renewal area is primarily residential with some corner commercial establishments, churches, and the Great Blacks in Wax Museum.

The Real Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, § 12-105.1, requires that existing State or local condemnation authority as of July 1, 2011 be reauthorized. Therefore, City Council Bill 11-0646, if approved, would extend the acquisition and condemnation authority existing under this Urban Renewal ordinance through and including December 31, 2014. This legislation would also extend the life of the Urban Renewal Plan an additional 10 years. Finally, the bill clarifies that the City may acquire all rights, title and interest or any private rights of use of streets or alleys that abut or are adjacent to the acquisition properties and which are shown lying within the perimeter of the disposition map.

Based on these findings, the Department of Public Works supports passage of City Council Bill 11-0646.
