> City Council Bill 15-0471- Charter Amendment – Multi-Member Council Re:

Districts

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has been asked to review City Council Bill 15-0471 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill amends the City Charter. It reduces the number of Councilmembers from 14 members to 12 members and reduces the number of council districts from 14 to four. The bill requires that three members be elected from each of the four districts. Lastly, the bill submits the amendment to City voters for adoption or rejection.

The substance of the bill presents no legal impediments.

Under Article XI-A, Section 5 of the Maryland Constitution, a resolution of the Mayor and City Council, such as City Council Bill 15-0471, is an appropriate method of initiating an amendment to the Baltimore City Charter. The Law Department, therefore, approves the resolution for form and legal sufficiency as drafted.
