BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows: 12 **Baltimore City Code** 13 **Article 22. Retirement Systems** 14 **Subtitle – Fire and Police Employees' Retirement Systems** 15 § 34. Benefits. 16 (s-1) Minimum benefits for beneficiaries effective July 1, 2010. 17 (1) If a spousal beneficiary of a sworn member who, before August 1, 1996, retired or 18 died while in service [with 20 or more years of service] is receiving periodic 19 retirement benefits from this System as of June 30, 2010, in an annual amount that is 20 less than \$16,000, that beneficiary shall receive an increase in his or her periodic 21 retirement benefits so that the annual amount of those benefits equals \$16,000. This 22 increase shall be payable with the first full payroll period beginning after July 1, 23 2010. 24

5	(3)	If a spousal beneficiary's retirement benefits under this System are subject to a
6		domestic relations order, the annual amount of that beneficiary's benefits prior to
7		assignment under that order shall be used in determining whether the beneficiary is
8		eligible for the minimum benefit under this subsection.
9	<u>(s-2)</u>	Minimum benefits, effective January 1, 2012, for beneficiaries of members who
0		RETIRED ON ACCOUNT OF LINE-OF-DUTY DISABILITY.
1	<u>(1)</u>	If a spousal beneficiary of a sworn member who, before August 1, 1996,
2		RETIRED ON ACCOUNT OF A LINE-OF-DUTY DISABILITY WITH LESS THAN 20 YEARS OF
3		SERVICE IS RECEIVING PERIODIC RETIREMENT BENEFITS FROM THIS SYSTEM AS OF
4		DECEMBER 31, 2011, IN AN ANNUAL AMOUNT THAT IS LESS THAN \$16,000, THAT
5		BENEFICIARY SHALL RECEIVE AN INCREASE IN HIS OR HER PERIODIC RETIREMENT
6		BENEFITS SO THAT THE ANNUAL AMOUNT OF THOSE BENEFITS EQUALS \$16,000. THIS
7		INCREASE SHALL BE PAYABLE WITH THE FIRST FULL PAYROLL PERIOD BEGINNING
8		AFTER JANUARY 1, 2012.
9	<u>(2)</u>	If a spousal beneficiary of a sworn member who, before August 1, 1996,
20		RETIRED ON ACCOUNT OF A LINE-OF-DUTY DISABILITY WITH LESS THAN 20 YEARS OF
21		SERVICE COMMENCES RECEIVING BENEFITS FROM THIS SYSTEM ON OR AFTER JANUARY
22		1, 2012, THE ANNUAL AMOUNT OF THAT BENEFICIARY'S PERIODIC RETIREMENT
23		BENEFITS SHALL BE NOT LESS THAN \$16,000.
24	<u>(3)</u>	If a spousal beneficiary's retirement benefits under this System are
25		SUBJECT TO A DOMESTIC RELATIONS ORDER, THE ANNUAL AMOUNT OF THAT
26		BENEFICIARY'S BENEFITS PRIOR TO ASSIGNMENT UNDER THAT ORDER SHALL BE USED
27		IN DETERMINING WHETHER THE BENEFICIARY IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE MINIMUM BENEFIT
28		UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
29		ON 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
30	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
