## Ordinance of Estimates for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2026 Day One (1) – Agency Budget Hearings

**Sponsor:** President Cohen at the request of the Administration (Department of Finance)

**Introduced:** May 12, 2025

#### **Purpose:**

**For the purpose of** providing the appropriations estimated to be needed by each agency of the City of Baltimore for operating programs and capital projects during the Fiscal 2026 year.

Effective: Beginning July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

#### Law

Article VI – Board of Estimates of the City Charter outlines the rules and regulations which pertains to the budget schedule.

- § 3. Fiscal year; Budget schedule.
- (a) Fiscal year. The fiscal, budget, and accounting year of the City shall begin on the first day of July and end on the thirtieth day of June in every year unless otherwise provided by law.
- (b) Notice and hearing. At least thirty days prior to the adoption by the Board of Estimates of a proposed Ordinance of Estimates the Board shall make public the Director of Finance's recommended operating budget, the Planning Commission's recommended capital budget and long-range capital improvement 11/11/18 -147- ART. VI, § 4 BALTIMORE CITY CHARTER program, and the reports of the Director of Finance and Planning Commission on these documents. Thereafter, the Board shall hold public hearings at which members of the City Council, heads of municipal agencies, and citizens shall have the opportunity to appear before the Board to speak for or against the inclusion of any appropriation in the proposed Ordinance of Estimates.
- (c) Submission to Council. The Board of Estimates shall submit to the City Council the proposed Ordinance of Estimates for the next fiscal year at least forty-five days before the beginning of that fiscal year.
- (d) Adoption by Council. The City Council shall have at least forty days after receipt of the Board's proposed Ordinance of Estimates to enact an Ordinance of Estimates. The City Council shall adopt an

Ordinance of Estimates at least five days prior to the beginning of the fiscal year to which it is applicable if the Board of Estimates submits its proposed Ordinance of Estimates within the period prescribed by Section 3(c).

### **Background**

On <u>Thursday, May 15, 2025</u>, the City Council began its budget process. Representatives from the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, Planning Department and the Baltimore City Public School System came before the committee to discuss:

- (Budget Overview for the Ordinance of Estimates for Estimates for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2026), an overview for the Fiscal Year 2026 Recommended Capital Improvement Plan, and
- (Budget Overview for the Operating Budget for the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2026

On <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>May 28, 2025</u>, the Budget and Appropriations Committee will reconvene to begin DAY ONE of the budget hearings, whereas several agency representatives will come before the committee/councilmembers to discuss his/her budget.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE**

The Department of Finance is responsible for safeguarding the fiscal integrity of the City of Baltimore through the development and implementation of sound financial policies and practices.

Operating through five Bureaus (<u>Revenue Collection</u>, <u>Budget and Management Research</u>, <u>Accounting and Payroll Services</u>, <u>Purchases</u>, <u>Treasury Management</u>), the <u>Office of Risk Management</u> and an Administrative Section, the Department is responsible for the following major functions:

- billing and collecting all funds owed to the City;
- investing and managing the City's surplus cash and funds held in trust;
- allocating available funds and monitoring City expenditures via the budget process;
- disbursing funds for services and goods rendered to the City;
- accounting for and reporting all funds;
- managing the City's debt portfolio, including policy development, issuance, and servicing;
- advising City agencies on risk management issues and in certain cases, obtaining and monitoring insurance policies;
- conducting City-wide safety and accident prevention programs;
- procuring supplies, services and equipment for most City agencies; and
- providing custom printing and graphics activity.

# **VISIT BALTIMORE**

<u>Civic Promotion</u> grants provide subsidies to non-profit organizations that provide cultural, historical, educational, and promotional activities in Baltimore. Civic Promotion provides <u>funding for Visit Baltimore</u>, Sail Baltimore, Pride of Baltimore, Baltimore National Heritage Area, Lexington Market, and Baltimore Public Markets.

**Visit Baltimore** is a 501(c)(6) nonprofit that generates economic benefits for the region by marketing Baltimore as an engaging cultural destination for visitors, an ideal destination for meetings and conventions, and as an advocate for the local tourism community. We also work to develop the next generation of hospitality leaders through the Visit Baltimore Education and Training Foundation.

#### WHAT WE DO

Visit Baltimore is the official destination marketing organization (DMO) for Baltimore. In this role, we:

- Inspire people to visit our great destination and to experience the products and services offered by our stakeholders.
- Generate economic benefits for the greater Baltimore region through the power of collaboration and partnership.
- Serve as the liaison between members, customer and stakeholders.
- Provide stakeholders with the necessary tools and information to make their products and services competitive in the marketplace.

#### WHO WE SERVE

- Members of the tourism industry such as hotels, restaurants and attractions.
- Customers such as meeting planners, tour operators, individual tourists and media.
- Stakeholders including government, citizens and member organizations. Member organizations represented include lodging, dining, arts, attractions, shopping, transportation, associations and government agencies.

# **CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S OFFICE (CAO)**

The Baltimore City Charter establishes the Mayor as the Chief Executive Officer and empowers the appointment of persons to aid in the discharge of duties.

The Mayor's Office oversees the operation of City departments, establishes citywide policies, reviews and develops programs, and executes ordinances and resolutions. The Mayoralty is comprised of the following activities: City Administrator, Administrative Services, Chief of Staff, Mayor's Office, Communications and External Affairs, Neighborhoods, Constituent Services, Special Events, Public Safety, Economic Development, Equity, Youth, and Human Services, and Government Relations. In Fiscal 2026, the following offices have been established as stand-alone services: Immigrant and Multicultural Affairs, African American Male Engagement, LGBTQ Affairs, Older Adults Affairs and Advocacy, Performance and Innovation, Infrastructure Development, Opioid Restitution Administration, and Art, Culture, and Entertainment.

The City Administrator's Office manages the day-to-day government operations across the entire city enterprise, ensuring the effective, efficient, and equitable delivery of city services.

# MAYOR'S OFFICE OF RECOVERY PROGRAMS

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) provided \$641 million in one-time funding to the City of Baltimore in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency and its negative economic impacts. Mayor Brandon M. Scott established the Mayor's Office of Recovery Programs to administer this funding on behalf of the City via an application process.

The City was required by law to obligate funds by December 31, 2024. The City must fully expend all funds by December 31, 2026.

The guiding principles for the Recovery Office are:

- **Impact** We are committed to maximizing the use of American Rescue Plan Act funds for the benefit of Baltimore City residents.
- Transparency We will share information and data on how funding decisions are made, how funds are spent, and what results Recovery Programs achieve with agencies and the public.
- **Equity** We will prioritize funding decisions on communities that have been disproportionately harmed.
- Accountability We will follow federal guidelines and requirements to ensure that funds are appropriately spent and accurately accounted for.
- Responsibility We will establish rigorous standards for compliance and performance for grant applicants and recipients to follow while also providing technical assistance and guidance as needed.

In addition to continuing its work overseeing ARPA funds, in Fiscal 2026, the Mayor's Office of Recovery Programs will also be responsible for administering the Opioid Restitution Fund across multiple city agencies, following a series of settlements with various pharmaceutical manufacturers and distributors.

#### **Administration (410) 396-3310**

#### **Bureau of Solid Waste (410) 396-5134**

The Bureau of Solid Waste maintains the City's cleanliness through its multifaceted waste collections, cleaning and disposal programs. The Bureau is divided into four divisions each with different areas of responsibility in waste management and disposal. The Bureau collects and disposes of residential trash and recycling, has a City-wide mechanical street sweeping program, cleans and boards vacant properties, runs the Rat Rubout Program, and offers specialized recycling collections of scrap metal, electronics, Styrofoam and household hazardous waste.

#### Bureau of Water and Wastewater (410) 396-3500

The Water and Wastewater Bureau focuses on producing and transporting clean drinking water and collecting and treating wastewater plus the associated maintenance functions; additionally, it manages the metering and billing of approximately 412,000 retail accounts in Baltimore City and Baltimore County, as well as wholesale accounts for Carroll, Anne Arundel, Harford, and Howard Counties.

#### Office of Asset Management (410) 396-0009

<u>The Office of Asset Management</u> is responsible for optimizing the service life of sewer and water linear infrastructure through the development and implementation of proactive inspection and preventative maintenance programs. The Office implements a strategic approach to managing these assets at a sustainable cost and an acceptable level of risk. The Office aims to transition the Department of Public Works from a reactive mode of asset maintenance to a proactive mode,

utilizing risk-based planning and other asset management principles to make sound decisions on managing its assets.

#### Office of Compliance and Research (410) 396-0732

<u>This Office of Compliance and Research</u> is committed to enhancing environmental regulatory compliance for the Department through collaboration, management program improvements, and regulatory enforcement. The 40-position staff of this Office consists of engineers, scientists, and planners. The Office includes the following sections: Plans Review and Inspections, Water Quality Monitoring and Investigations, Watershed Planning and Partnerships, and Research and Technical Resources. The Plans Review and Inspections Section is responsible for all DPW review of both public and private construction projects as a part of the permitting process.

#### Office of Engineering and Construction (410) 396-3437

The Office of Engineering and Construction (OEC) is responsible for planning and directing the design, construction, contract administration, and inspection of utility infrastructure, dams, bridges, and water and wastewater treatment facilities. The OEC also reviews and inspects construction to assure adherence to codes, costs, progress and quality as programmed in the DPW capital improvement plan. OEC is responsible for engineering design for contracts to construct and maintain water and wastewater treatment plants, pumping stations, and the collection and conveyance system. and provides a wide array of on call construction services that serve the urgent needs of the DPW Bureau of Water and Wastewater Utility Maintenance Division.

#### Office of Fiscal Management (410) 396-5182

<u>The Office of Fiscal Management</u> is responsible for the preparation and monitoring of DPW's operating and capital budgets, rates and financial forecasting, capital project financing, procurement and inter-jurisdictional cost sharing agreements.

#### Office of Legislative Affairs (410) 396-1960

<u>The Office</u> is responsible for participating in policy analyses and is the intermediary between this Department and elected officials at the City, State and federal levels, in concert with the Mayor's Office of Government Relations. All legislative proposals and positions either originate with or are processed through this Office. Whether it is resolving a prolonged constituent problem, providing briefings on agency initiatives or policies, or presenting testimony, it is important that the Department speak with one voice when appearing before or interacting with our elected officials.

#### Office of Strategy and Performance (410) 396-3320

The Office of Strategy and Performance (OSAP) provides assistance and takes the lead in making sure key projects and programs have thorough advanced planning, ensuring that each implementation step is well supported, managed, tracked and monitored from conception to completion. OSAP compares project and program outcomes with the desired objectives to help identify where improvements may be needed to secure even better performance. It is the role of OSAP to continuously provide guidance in the application of industry best practices.

**SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That the amounts set forth in Section 2 above designated deappropriations and enclosed in parentheses shall revert to the surpluses of the respective funds and be available for appropriation by this or subsequent ordinances.

#### **SECTION 4.** AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

- (a) The City reasonably expects to reimburse the expenditures described in Subsection (b) of this Section with the proceeds of one or more obligations (as such term is used in Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-1(b) to be incurred by the City (or any entity controlled by the City within the meaning of Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-1). The City intends that this Section of this Ordinance of Estimates (as this Ordinance of Estimates may be amended from time to time) shall serve as a declaration of the City's reasonable intention to reimburse expenditures as required by Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-2 and any successor regulation.
- (b) The City intends that this declaration will cover all reimbursement of expenditures for capital projects or programs approved in the capital budget contained in this Ordinance of Estimates to the extent that the City has appropriated in this Ordinance of Estimates to pay the cost thereof from one or more obligations to be issued by the City (or any entity controlled by the City within the meaning of Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-1). The term "obligation" (as such term is defined in Treas. Reg. Section 1.150(b) and as used in this Section) includes general obligation bonds and notes, revenue bonds and notes, leases, conditional purchase agreements and other obligations of the City (or any entity controlled by the City within the meaning of Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-1).
- (c) The maximum anticipated debt expected to be incurred by the City to reimburse the cost of each capital project or program in this Ordinance of Estimates is the applicable appropriation listed in this Ordinance of Estimates from the proceeds of one or more obligations, as such appropriations may be increased or decreased.

**SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That the foregoing appropriations in summary consist of:
