Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairwoman McCray welcomed colleagues, members of the Administration, and attendees. Chairwoman introduced 25-0075, Operating Budget for the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2026.
- 2. The floor was open to Christopher Doherty, Chief Financial Officer and Alison Perkins-Cohen, Chief of Staff from Baltimore City Public Schools System [See PowerPoint].
 - The budget presented reflects a 6 % increase in year-over-year funding dedicated to sustaining the major investments and salary increases for teachers and other staff.
 - Every school's budget for FY26 reflects a year-over-year increase from FY25
 - Blueprint Design indicates that schools with higher-need student populations received more funding
 - End of ESSER however some programming will continue but will need to come out of the school budget
 - Increase position costs
 - Update on the reimbursement of \$48 million (funding through the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief fund (ESSER) allotted funding through the CARES Act).
 - Due to the injunction that was granted BCPSS was able to submit all reimbursements by the deadline of May 12, 2025.
 - BCPSS are still concerned about the federal funding landscape for the upcoming year.
 - Proposed FY26 Budget priorities
 - o Accelerating student achievement in literacy and math
 - Building college and career readiness through secondary success and innovation
 - Improving attendance and dropout re-engagement
 - Supporting mental health
- 3. Chairwoman McCray opened the floor to questions from the committee members. Topics discussed in the hearing are as follows:
 - Building stronger partnerships within the city. [See further study request].
 - Provide a list of partnering City Agencies with BCPSS (ex: JARC Baltimore)
 - Conversations with CP and Mayor's team about the need for city agencies in terms of hiring for city jobs.
 - Shared the accolade for Commodore John Rodger's Elementary School
 - Won the 2025 VEX Robotics World Championship

- o Importance of uplifting successes
- Future of Community School Coordinators
 - o Vital role for students and families \$16 million investment in the budget
 - o Half are employed by BCPSS and other half by external partners
 - Sharing needs/resources with Community School Coordinators
 - Need to preserve this program through legislation at the State level
