16	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
17	Department of General Services shall proceed to condemn and open certain streets and alleys
18	bounded by Hoffman Street, Proctor Street, East Preston Street, and Greenmount Avenue, and
19	more particularly described as follows:
20	Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the south
21	side of Hoffman Street, 66 feet wide, and the west side of Wirton Street, 38 feet
22	wide, and running thence binding on the south side of said Hoffman Street
23	Easterly 38.0 feet to intersect the east side of said Wirton Street; thence binding
24	on the east side of said Wirton Street Southerly 245.1 feet, more or less, to
25	intersect the north side of a 10-foot alley, laid out in the rear of the properties
26	known as Nos. 700 through 724 E. Preston Street; thence binding on the north
27	side of said 10-foot alley Westerly 38.0 feet to intersect the west side of said
28	Wirton Street, and thence binding on the west side of said Wirton Street Northerly
29	245.1 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

Council Bill 11-0728

Beginning for Parcel No. 2 at the point formed by the intersection of the west side of a varying in width alley, laid out in the rear of the properties known as Nos. 1303 through 1327 Greenmount Avenue and the south side of Hoffman Street, 66 feet wide, said point of beginning being distant Easterly 104.6 feet, more or less, measured along the south side of said Hoffman Street from the east side of Greenmount Avenue, 66 feet wide, and running thence binding on the south side of said Hoffman Street Easterly 9.8 feet, more or less, to intersect the east side of said varying in width alley; thence binding on the east side of said varying in width alley Southerly 245.1 feet, more or less, to intersect the north side of a 10-foot alley, laid out in the rear of the properties known as Nos. 700 through 716 E. Preston Street; thence binding on the north side of said 10-foot alley Westerly 10.0 feet to intersect the west side of aforesaid varying in width alley, and thence binding on the west side of aforesaid varying in width alley Northerly 245.1 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

As delineated on Plat 321-A-32, prepared by the Survey Control Section and filed on June 8, 2011, in the Office of the Department of General Services.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the proceedings for the condemnation and opening of certain streets and alleys and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and regulations adopted by the Director of General Services and filed with the Department of Legislative Reference.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
