17	(1) Following each census of the United States, the Mayor shall prepare a plan for

20	census] 60 days after the publication of the United States Census Bureau's redistricting census data for Baltimore City.
21	REDISTRICTING CENSUS DATA FOR BALTIMORE CITY.
22	(2) After the Mayor's plan is presented to the City Council, the Council may adopt [it]
23	THE MAYOR'S PLAN, [or] amend it, or [the City Council may] adopt another plan. If
24	no plan has been adopted by the City Council within [sixty] 60 days after the Mayor's
