**Introduced:** *January 27, 2025*

#### **Purpose:**

**For the purpose** of requiring the City Administrator, Commissioner of the Baltimore Health Department, and the Director of the Department of General Services to appear before the City Council to present an assessment of the City’s readiness to comply with the provisions of Chapter 764 of the Acts of the Maryland General Assembly of 2024, “Emergency Services – Automated External Defibrillator and Naloxone Co-Location Initiative – Requirements for Public Buildings,” by updating its health and safety protocols for all City buildings.

Effective: Upon enactment.

#### **Background**

The committee held a hearing on this Resolution on September 17, 2025. Following are notes taken during the hearing:

## Major Issues Discussed

1. Councilman Conway, primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks. Some comments, remarks etc. were:
  - Our goal is to continue the hard work of saving lives!
  - He explained why the hearing is being held, background
  - We want to know what it will take for the City to come into compliance, and
  - this Resolution is part of two (2) bills, the other bill, 25-0014 – Emergency Medical Services – Administration of Buprenorphine; a hearing will be held on October 29<sup>th</sup>.
2. Chairwoman Porter went over the agency reports with the agency representatives. The representative from the Mayor’s Office explained what House Bill 1099 does and what the City intends to implement to follow the law.
  - He talked about which organizations and/or city buildings that must comply and/or does not have to follow the law
  - He stated, “Every city building does not have to comply!
  - That all city pools, fire departments and police officers are equipped with Naloxone!
  - And that the Mayor will work to make sure the law is followed and implemented!
3. Councilman Conway gave some remarks about what he would like to see occur, such as:
  - Signage needed
  - Concern: Storage of Naloxone – (will need some back up)
  - Implemented:
    - Training
    - Prioritization, and leadership
    - Requested by Councilman Conway: Please submit a list of all city buildings that already have Naloxone (Narcan) in the building(s).
4. Committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns, and made comments. Some highlighted topics of discussion, comments and/concerns were:
  - Questions:
    - How many city buildings do we have?
    - How many are compliant with State law (Bill 1099) requiring Naloxone to be co-located with automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in all public buildings, including city-owned facilities?
    - Timeline:
      - What is the timeline for the rollout per State Law? Per Mayor’s representative, will research and provide a follow-up!
      - Which buildings will be included vs which will not be included? And how do you determine this?
    - What is needed to ensure city buildings are compliant?
    - Are there any aspects of Senate Bill 1099 that present challenges for compliance?
5. Councilman Conway gave closing remarks, “He thanked the Mayor for setting up training for employees and encourages employees to take the training. We must be thoughtful about the rollout! This could be an important step to saving lives and hopes to revisit this subject in the future!”
6. Hearing recessed.

On Wednesday, November, 2025, the committee is scheduled to hold a voting session on this Resolution.

Also attached is the data received regarding Committee Member Conway’s request listed in #3 above.

A RESOLUTION ENTITLED

1 A COUNCIL RESOLUTION concerning

2 **Informational Hearing – Availability of Naloxone in Public Buildings**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the City Administrator, Commissioner of the Baltimore Health  
4 Department, and the Director of the Department of General Services to appear before the  
5 City Council to present an assessment of the City’s readiness to comply with the provisions  
6 of Chapter 764 of the Acts of the Maryland General Assembly of 2024, “Emergency  
7 Services – Automated External Defibrillator and Naloxone Co-Location  
8 Initiative – Requirements for Public Buildings”, by updating its health and safety protocols  
9 for all City buildings.

10 **Recitals**

11 **WHEREAS**, Chapter 764 of the Acts of the Maryland General Assembly of 2024,  
12 “Emergency Services – Automated External Defibrillator and Naloxone Co-Location  
13 Initiative – Requirements for Public Buildings”, requires local jurisdictions to require that  
14 naloxone be co-located with each automated defibrillator placed in a public building.

15 **WHEREAS**, to ensure Baltimore’s full compliance with Chapter 764, it is necessary to  
16 determine whether relevant City agencies, including the Baltimore City Health Department and  
17 the Department of General Services, are meeting the standards established in the Chapter.

18 **WHEREAS**, City agencies must ensure that the City’s public health protocols and building  
19 standards align with the requirements of Chapter 764.

20 **WHEREAS**, the Baltimore City Council recognizes the importance of maintaining public  
21 health and safety standards in the City’s facilities and ensuring that all appropriate measures are  
22 taken to comply with State law to improve health outcomes and safeguard City residents.

23 **WHEREAS**, the City Council is committed to taking any immediate action necessary to  
24 rectify any deficiencies identified by City agencies and to ensuring that all facilities and  
25 operations comply with State-mandated health and safety standards, as directed by Chapter 764.

**Council Bill 25-0005R**

1       **WHEREAS**, the City Council encourages continuing collaboration between the City  
2 Administrator, the Health Department, the Department of General Services, and any other  
3 relevant City agencies to facilitate ongoing compliance with Chapter 764.

4       **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the City  
5 Council requires the City Administrator, Commissioner of the Baltimore Health Department, and  
6 the Director of the Department of General Services to appear before the City Council to present  
7 an assessment of the City’s readiness to comply with the provisions of Chapter 764 of the Acts  
8 of the Maryland General Assembly of 2024 by updating its health and safety protocols for all  
9 City buildings.

10       **AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the City  
11 Administrator, the Baltimore City Health Commissioner, the Director of the Department of  
12 General Services, the Secretary of the Maryland Department of Health, and the Mayor’s  
13 Legislative Liaison to the City Council.
