## Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilmember Ramos, primary sponsor of the Ordinance gave opening remarks. She talked about what the Bill is designed to do. She also talked about the proposed amendments she submitted.
- 2. Committee/councilmembers went over the agency reports with the agency representatives.
  - The representative from the Department of Finance talked a little more about what the bill does stating:
    - It will have a fiscal impact (2 additional positions will be needed)
    - More/updated software needed
    - Is working closely with the BCIT Office, and
    - Talked about why the Department requested the date to be extended by one year
- 3. Committee/councilmembers asked the representative from the Department of Finance questions and talked about some of their concerns. Some highlights of same were:
  - o Concerns/Comments
    - Several thoughts, comments and concerns requiring past rollouts such as:
      - Monthly payments established by the Department of Public Works
      - How water billing system was rolled out
      - The complexities associated with bringing a new system on-line and making a sound commitment to meet the January 2023 deadline
      - Concern: To make sure this is done right!
    - Comment: Hope the installment plan is successful and you have to think ahead to prepare for good outcomes
  - Question(s)
    - Is January 2023 a reasonable time/deadline to have the plan implemented? What is your take on this?
      - Per Director Raymond "Out of your concerns, the Department is requesting six (6) additional months (until July 1, 2023) to complete the plan. However, our goal will be to have the plan completed by January 1, 2023."
- 4. Four (4) speakers gave public testimony; all in support of the Ordinance. Some highlighted from their testimonies were:
  - o Talked about the impact and hardships associated with tax sales
  - o Many clients are over seventy (70) years of age
  - Homeowners are made vulnerable by the way the system is currently setup to pay their property taxes, this bill will help and make things more affordable
  - Concern: Choosing the right vendor; must be qualified to develop the system and capable to do the processes needed
