18 19	(2) Obstructing or impeding the free flow of traffic within an intersection or a marked crosswalk or by a commercial vehicle is punishable by a fine of \$250.
20 21 22 23 24	(3) Parking, stopping, or standing in a manner that obstructs or impedes the free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic along a block face abutting or immediately across the street from the grounds of a building used as a public or private kindergarten, elementary school, or secondary school, on any school day between the hours of 7 a.m and 9 a.m. or between the hours of 2 p.m. and 5 p.m., is punishable by a fine of \$250.

1 2	(3) Standing within 15 feet of a fire plug or fire hydrant in violation of § 6-6(a) {"Fire hydrants"} of this article is punishable by a fine of \$75.
3 4	(4) Stopping in front of or opposite a fire engine house in violation of § 6-6(c) {"Engine houses"} of this article is punishable by a fine of \$75.
5	(5) Stopping or parking in a transit stop is punishable by a fine of \$75.
6 7 8	(6) Parking or standing a noncommercial vehicle of more than 20,000 pounds gross weight or a commercial vehicle of 20,000 pounds or less gross weight in violation of § 6-26(c) {"Nighttime hours"} of this article is punishable by a fine of \$75.
9 10	[(7) Parking or standing in a bike lane in violation of § 20-5 {"Parking restrictions"} of this article is punishable by a fine of \$75.]
11 12 13	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
14 15	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
