## AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

City Streets - Closing -1 10-Foot Allev 2 FOR the purpose of condemning and closing a 10-foot alley laid out in the rear of the properties 3 known as 1401 through 1477 Reynolds Street, extending from Fort Avenue northeasterly to 4 5 Clement Street, as shown on Plat 114-A-20A in the Office of the Department of Public 6 Works; and providing for a special effective date. By authority of 7 Article I - General Provisions 8 Section 4 9 10 and Article II - General Powers 11 Sections 2, 34, 35 12 **Baltimore City Charter** 13 (1996 Edition) 14 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Department of Public Works shall proceed to condemn and close a 10-foot alley laid out in the 16 17 18

rear of the properties known as 1401 through 1477 Reynolds Street, extending from Fort Avenue northeasterly to Clement Street, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the northeast side of Fort Avenue, 82.5 feet wide, and the northwest side of a 10-foot alley, laid out in the rear of the properties known as Nos. 1401 through 1477 Reynolds Street, said point of beginning being distant Southeasterly 55.0 feet, more or less, measured along the northeast side of said Fort Avenue from the southeast side of Reynolds Street, 50 feet wide, and running thence binding on the northwest side of said 10-foot alley, Northeasterly 469.1 feet, more or less, to intersect the southwest side of Clement Street, 66 feet wide; thence binding on the southwest side of said Clement Street, Southeasterly 10.0 feet to intersect the southeast side of said 10-foot alley; thence binding on the southeast side of said 10-foot alley,

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1 2 3	Southwesterly 469.1 feet, more or less, to intersect the northeast side of said Fort Avenue, and thence binding on the northeast side of said Fort Avenue, Northwesterly 10.0 feet to the place of beginning.		
4 5	As delineated on Plat 114-A-20A, prepared by the Survey Control Section and filed on March 9, 2007, in the Office of the Department of Public Works.		
6	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the proceedings for the condemnation and		
7	closing of the alley and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in accordance		
8	with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and regulations		
9	adopted by the Director of Public Works and filed with the Department of Legislative Reference.		
10	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all		
11	subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of		
12	Baltimore continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their		
13	use has been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or		
14	interfere with them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council		
15	and, in the application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every		
16	kind, arising out of the removal, alteration, or interference.		
17	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no building or structure of any kind		
18	(including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of		
19	the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by		
20	the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council		
21	or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and		
22	relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director of Public		
23	Works of Baltimore City.		
24	SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all		
25	subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City		
26	Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon		
27	notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.		
28	SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That at all times after the closing under this		
29	Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized		
30	representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and		
31	appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining,		
32	repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from		
33	or pay compensation to the owner of the property.		
34	SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it		

is enacted.
