Informational Hearing - Well-being of Lesbian Women in Baltimore

Introduced: April 28, 2025

Purpose:

FOR the purpose of inviting representatives from the Mayor's Office, the Baltimore City Health Department, the Baltimore Police Department, the Baltimore City Public School System, the Mayor's Office of Homeless Services, the Mayor's Office of Employment Development, the Mayor's Office of LGBTQ Affairs, the Baltimore City Office of Equity and Civil Rights, the Office of the State's Attorney for Baltimore City, the Baltimore City Department of Social Services, the Maryland Department of Health, and Behavioral Health System Baltimore to update the Council on services provided to, and the general well-being of, lesbian women in Baltimore.

Effective: Upon enactment.

Analysis

Background

Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilwoman Porter, primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks.
- 2. Chairwoman Porter went over the agency reports and/or had discussion with the agency representatives.
- 3. An attendee gave public testimony. Some highlighted comments and/or topics of her discussion were:
 - o Thanked everyone for advocating on behalf of the community
 - o Baltimore City Health Department is doing a good job working with the community!
 - We need to continue to create programs for people who have mental health issues
 - More programs are need for all people who have mental health issues
- 4. Committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns, and made comments. Some highlighted topics of discussion, comments and/or concern were:
 - o Question(s)
 - Inter-Partner Violence is a huge issue and often goes unrecorded!
 - To Health Department What are you doing to address same?
 - How does your training translate to the community?
 - To Police Department: When incidents are reported for inter-partner violence how do you address same and work with other agencies?
 - To Health Department What are you doing to address same?
 - How do you talk about and track progress within communities?
 - o Comments:
 - Committee member(s) thanked Chairwoman Porter for breaking out three (3) separate Resolutions
 - "We are keeping an eye on Washington, D.C., we know it is a tough time now, but you have our support."
- 4. Chairwoman Porter informed the attendees that there will be an amendment(s) to the Resolution(s); to include other pertinent populations that were missed in the current Resolutions. Hearing recessed.
