REQUEST: City Council Bill #20-0607/ City Streets — Naming an Unnamed Alley, Located in the Rear of 216 East Biddle Street, Mura Alley:

For the purpose of naming an unnamed alley, located in the rear of 216 East Biddle Street, between Hunter Street and Guilford Avenue, Mura Alley.

RECOMMENDATION: Approval

SITE/GENERAL AREA

This block is located in the eastern end of the Mid-Town Belvedere neighborhood, which has a diversity of uses and scale of development. The alley to be named is a concrete "V" cross-section alley. The immediate block in this area are primarily residential, with occasional commercial uses along primary streets. The adjacent block has rowhomes in the 200-block of East Biddle street on the south side of the alley, as well as a two-story brick office building and surface parking lots on the north side of the alley.

HISTORY

There are no previous legislative or Planning Commission actions regarding this site.

ANALYSIS

<u>Background</u>: The owner of 216 East Biddle Street has a multi-family building with two dwelling units. The rear unit has access to the rear alley for entry to that unit. They would like the alley to be named, so that the rear unit can have an address. The purpose for addressing is so that the unit can be located by Fire and EMS services. Staff understands that there may be other units in the block that have rear entries as well.

When naming streets, staff is normally concerned for the purpose of the naming, as there can be other effects for development purposes. In this case, the alley is truly an alley in its construction, and not a street. If approved for naming, the street would not be eligible for use to create new property addresses by way of subdivision, as that would create inner-block parcels that would not independently meet the normal development rules and requirements. With that only reservation, staff has no objection to the naming of this alley. The block plat is included below, with the proposed portion for naming highlighted in yellow.

Notification: The Midtown Community Benefits District has been notified of this action.
