14	In this section, the following terms have the meanings indicated.

16	"Freight loading zone" means a space adjacent to a curb that, during
17	SPECIFIED TIMES, IS RESERVED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE USE OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES
18	DURING THE EXPEDITIOUS LOADING OR UNLOADING OF PROPERTY.

20	"Passenger loading zone" means a space adjacent to a curb that, during

14	for the purpose of and while actually engaged in EXPEDITIOUSLY loading or
15	unloading passengers, [when such] AS LONG AS ITS stopping does not interfere

18	(D) [(c)] PARKING RESTRICTIONS – Passenger LOADING zones.
19	No person [shall] MAY stop a vehicle in [the] A PASSENGER LOADING zone DURING ITS
20	OPERATIONAL HOURS for any purpose or period of time other than for the expeditious
21	loading or unloading of passengers AND THEIR BAGGAGE [at any place marked as a
22	passenger curb loading zone during hours when the regulations applicable to such curb
23	loading zones are effective, and then, only for a period not to exceed 10 minutes].
24	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
25	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
26	Ordinance.
27	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day

after the date it is enacted.
