Re: City Council Bill 18-0192 – Termination of Administrative Parking Regulations – Peak Hour Parking Restrictions on the 2800 Block of Echodale Avenue, the 4100 through 4900 Blocks of Hillen Road, and the 5000 through 5300 blocks of Perring Parkway.

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 18-0192 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would terminate the peak hour parking restrictions for several blocks on Echodale Avenue, Hillen Road and Perring Parkway. Any administrative regulation concerning general parking, stopping or one-way streets implemented by the Department of Transportation may be rescinded or modified by ordinance pursuant to Section 2-6(d) of Article 31 of the Baltimore City Code.

This bill is the required legislation to rescind these parking restrictions, which the Law Department approves for form and legal sufficiency.
