15	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the	
16	Department of Public Works shall proceed to condemn and close an 85-foot wide portion of Fort	
17	Avenue, extending from Fort McHenry National Monument, northwesterly 130.3 feet, and more	
18	particularly described as follows:	
19	Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the	
20	southwest side of Fort Avenue, 82.5 feet wide, and the southeast side of Fort	
21	Avenue, as realigned and widened to a width of 167.5 feet, said point of	
22	beginning being distant 58.58 feet northwesterly measured along the southwest	
23	side of Fort Avenue, 82.5 feet wide from the southeasternmost extremity thereof,	
24	and running thence binding on the southeast side of Fort Avenue, 167.5 feet wide,	
25	Southwesterly 85.0 feet to intersect the southwest side of last said Fort Avenue;	
26	thence binding on the southwest side of last said Fort Avenue, Northwesterly	
27	130.3 feet to intersect the northwest side of last said Fort Avenue; thence binding

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the proceedings for the condemnation and closing of a portion of Fort Avenue and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and regulations adopted by the Director of Public Works and filed with the Department of Legislative Reference.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That after the closing under this Ordinance, all subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their use has been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or interfere with them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council and, in the application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every kind, arising out of the removal, alteration, or interference.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That no building or structure of any kind (including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director of Public Works of Baltimore City.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That after the closing under this Ordinance, all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.
29 30 31 32 33 34	SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That at all times after the closing under this Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from or pay compensation to the owner of the property.
