AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Illegal Dumping – Penalties – Enforcement

- FOR the purpose of increasing certain penalties for illegal waste disposal; imposing liability for
 the cleanup and repairs damages on one who dumps or disposes material on City property;
- 4 clarifying and extending the prima facie responsibility of a vehicle's owner for material
- 5 transported in or disposed of from the vehicle to include lessees and renters of vehicles;
- 6 clarifying that the prohibition against dumping on private property extends to waste
- receptacles on that property; and generally relating to the disposal of waste and othermaterial.

14	No person may dump or dispose of any wire, glass, nails, garbage, waste, or any other matter

17	No person may dump or otherwise dispose of any earth, dirt, sand, ashes, gravel, rocks,
18	garbage, waste, or any other matter on any private property, INCLUDING IN OR NEAR ANY
19	WASTE RECEPTACLE ON THE PROPERTY, without the permission of the property owner or the
20	owner's agent.
21	§ 7-616. Responsibility of vehicle owner, LESSEE, ETC.
22	The registered owner of a vehicle OR, FOR A LEASED OR RENTED VEHICLE, THE LESSEE OR
23	RENTER, AS IDENTIFIED ON THE LEASE OR RENTAL AGREEMENT, is prima facie responsible for
24	any waste or other material transported in or disposed of from that vehicle.

26	Any person who, in violation of § 7-608 {"Dumping on public property"} of this
27	SUBTITLE OR IN VIOLATION OF ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, DUMPS OR OTHERWISE
28	DISPOSES OF MATTER ON PROPERTY OWNED, LEASED, OR CONTROLLED BY THE CITY IS LIABLE
29	TO THE CITY FOR THE COSTS OF:

3 4		In addition to any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement procedure, this subtitle may be enforced by issuance of:
5 6		 (1) an environmental citation under City Code Article 1, Subtitle 40 {"Environmental Control Board"}; or
7		(2) a civil citation under City Code Article 1, Subtitle 41 {"Civil Citations"}.
8		(b) Process not exclusive.

§ 7-631. Enforcement by Environmental or Civil Citation.

9 The issuance of a citation to enforce this subtitle does not preclude pursuing any other 10 civil or criminal remedy or enforcement action authorized by law.

11 § 7-632. Criminal penalties.

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12 (a) *Basic penalty:* \$1,000 and 90 days.

Except as specified in subsection (b) of this section, any person who violates any provision of this subtitle or who authorizes any employee or agent to violate any provision of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to any one or more of the following for each offense:

- 17 (1) a fine of not more than 1,000; and
- 18 (2) imprisonment for not more than 90 days.
- 19 (b) Enhanced penalty: \$1,000 and 12 months.
- If the violation entails the disposal, IN ANY 24-HOUR PERIOD, of MATERIAL THAT WEIGHS 21 25 or more pounds OR MATERIAL THAT COMPRISES MORE THAN 10 OR MORE CUBIC FEET 22 [of material in any 24-hour period], the penalty for a violation of this subtitle is any one 23 or more of the following for each offense:
- 24 (1) a fine of not more than 1,000;
- 25 (2) imprisonment for not more than 12 months; and
- 26 (3) revocation of the privilege of seeking a building permit in the City.
