Introduced by: Councilmember Conway and President Cohen Cosponosred by: Councilmembers Parker, Gray, Bullock, Blanchard, Jones, Ramos, and Schleifer Introduced and read first time: April 28, 2025 Assigned to: Committee on Legislative Investigations **REFERRED TO THE FOLLOWING AGENCIES: None** A RESOLUTION ENTITLED A COUNCIL RESOLUTION concerning Informational Hearing - Public Safety, Ratepayer Impact, and Oversight Failures in **Baltimore Gas and Electric Company Line Inspections** FOR the purpose of inviting representatives from the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company ("BGE") and the Maryland Public Service Commission ("PSC") to appear before the City Council to provide testimony and documentation regarding oversight failures in BGE gas infrastructure inspections. Recitals WHEREAS, BGE has stated on multiple occasions, including in a hearing before the City Council Committee on Legislative Investigations on February 20, 2025, that multi-year rate plans, STRIDE, and other accelerated cost recovery mechanisms are necessary to provide safe gas infrastructure. WHEREAS, on December 23, 2024, a group of former BGE employees filed a petition with the PSC with accusations of fraud and mismanagement by BGE related to gas infrastructure inspections.

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2025, the PSC Engineering Division issued a report in response to this petition which stated that, "BGE has not adequately demonstrated that it took affirmative actions to validate the safety and compliance of affected assets", and furthermore, that "the acknowledged pattern of falsification of records suggests a non-trivial violation of inspection integrity and safety protocols, increasing the potential for risks to the gas distribution system and public safety".

WHEREAS, the safety of Baltimore residents depends on the integrity of public infrastructure systems, including gas pipelines, which are subject to State-regulated inspections.

WHEREAS, the City Council is invested in public safety, ratepayer protection, and the
integrity of services delivered within Baltimore City, particularly where infrastructure may pose
life-threatening risks to neighborhoods, schools, and businesses.

1 **WHEREAS**, the City Council has a duty to ensure that residents are not unknowingly exposed 2 to unverified or unsafe gas systems.

WHEREAS, the Maryland Public Service Commission has a mission to "ensure safe, reliable,
and economic public utility and transportation service to the citizens of Maryland", and is
responsible for effective oversight.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, that the City
Council invites representatives from BGE and the PSC to provide testimony and documentation
regarding the investigation of falsified gas line inspection reports, abatement of any safety risks
to residents, and any financial implications for Baltimore ratepayers.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the CEO of the
Baltimore Gas and Electric Company, the CEO of the Exelon Corporation, the Chair and
Members of the Maryland Public Service Commission, the Governor's Legislative Liaison to the
City Council, and the Mayor's Legislative Liaison to the City Council.
