AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Civil Citations – Repeal of “Sunset”

FOR the purpose of abrogating the automatic termination of Ordinance 03-595 {“Civil Citations”}; providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to the issuance and enforcement of civil citations.

BY repealing and reordaining, with amendments
Ordinance 03-595
Section(s) 4

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Ordinance 03-595

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted. [This Ordinance will remain in effect for 2 years; at the end of that period, with no further action by the Mayor and City Council, it will be abrogated and of no further effect.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted, retroactive to September 13, 2005.
