1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 **Residential Permit Parking – Approving Extension of Area 43**

3 FOR the purpose of approving and extending the Parking Management Plan for Residential Permit
4 Parking Area 43; and providing for a special effective date.

10 **Recitals**

11 Effective November 19, 2011, the Executive Director of the Parking Authority issued an
12 administrative regulation that created, for a 6-month period, Residential Permit Parking Area
13 43 and adopted a Parking Management Plan for that Area.

14 On April 3, 2012, the Parking Authority gave written notice to the Council President of the
15 Authority's proposed administrative extension of Area 43, indefinitely.

16 On May 17, 2012, written objection to the administrative extension was submitted by a
17 councilmember who represents all or part of the affected area.

18 Under City Code Article 31, § 10-18, any extension of the administrative regulation for Area
19 43 now turns on the passage or failure of an Ordinance of the Mayor and City Council.

20 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the
21 Parking Management Plan for Residential Permit Parking Area 43, a copy of which is attached to
22 and incorporated in this Ordinance, is approved and extended, indefinitely.

23 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
24 enacted.
