3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the use of City vehicles for travel outside City limits except on  
4 official City business; delimiting certain terms; and generally relating to the use of City  
5 vehicles.

11 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the  
12 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

16 **§ 7-9. CITY VEHICLES.**

17 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

18 VEHICLES OWNED OR LEASED BY THE CITY OR BY A CITY-FUNDED AGENCY MAY NOT BE  
19 USED TO TRAVEL MORE THAN 25 MILES BEYOND THE CITY LIMITS EXCEPT ON OFFICIAL  
20 CITY BUSINESS.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law.  
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

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1 (B) *“OFFICIAL CITY BUSINESS” DELIMITED.*

2 TRAVEL TO OR FROM ONE’S OWN RESIDENCE DOES NOT CONSTITUTE OFFICIAL CITY  
3 BUSINESS FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.

4 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance  
5 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior  
6 Ordinance.

7 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day  
8 after the date it is enacted.
