10 11	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

15	§ 8-1.5. Foreclosure limitations on residences.
16 17	Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code to the contrary, the City may not institute a foreclosure of any municipal lien on residential property if:
18 19	(1) THE OUTSTANDING LIENS ON THE PROPERTY DO NOT INCLUDE A LIEN FOR UNPAID PROPERTY TAXES; AND
20 21	(2) THE PROPERTY IS NOT A VACANT STRUCTURE WITHIN THE MEANING OF BUILDING CODE § 115.4.

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1	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
2	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
3	Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
