Position: Support

The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 21-0149 - Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation – Mayoralty-Related: Office of the Inspector General - \$400,000, the purpose of which is to increase the Fiscal Year 2021 appropriation of General Funds by \$400,000 to M-R: Office of the Inspector General.

Background

The Baltimore City Charter requires that each agency ends the fiscal year in balance. The Department of Finance recommends appropriation transfers and supplementary appropriations when an agency is projected to close the fiscal year in deficit. This supplemental appropriation is required to meet the Charter mandate.

Fiscal Impact

M-R: Office of the Inspector General incurred unexpected expenditures for unbudgeted positions. This supplemental appropriation of \$400,000 is necessary to accommodate these unbudgeted costs. Revenue from the Recordation Tax will be used to cover these supplemental expenses.

Conclusion

This supplemental appropriation is required to meet the Charter mandate that annual agency expenditures do not exceed appropriations.

For the reasons stated above, the Department of Finance supports City Council Bill 21-0150.
