#### **Current Law**

Article 31 – Transit and Traffic, subtitle 20 of the Baltimore City Code governs and defines the residential permit parking program in Baltimore City

#### §10-19. Parking Management Plan - Amendment.

(a) By Ordinance

At any time after a Parking Management Plan has been adopted by administrative regulation, the Mayor and City Council may enact an Ordinance rescinding or modifying the administrative regulation and the Parking Management Plan created by it.

**Background** 

Currently, the Parking Management Plan Restatement RPP Area B in Washington Village allows non-Area B permit holders to park on weekdays from 3 pm to 10 pm for 1 hour. Council Bill 24-0547, which was brought forth by Councilmember Porter, will revise those weekday hours from 11 am to 10 pm.
