A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL CONCERNING

Charter Amendment – City Auditor – Powers and Duties

2 FOR the purpose of authorizing the City Auditor to issue subpoenas to certain individuals and
3 entities; requiring the City Auditor to provide a copy of certain completed audit reports to the
4 agency audited; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the City for
5 adoption or rejection.

11 **SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the
12 City Charter is proposed to be amended to read as follows:

Baltimore City Charter

Article V – Comptroller

15 **§ 8. Department of Audits – General powers and duties.**

16 (a) *In general.*

17 In accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards and State and
18 federal law, the City Auditor:

19 (1) shall at appropriate intervals conduct an audit of the financial transactions of
20 every municipal agency, except the Department of Audits;

21 (2) shall conduct an annual audit of all accounts, revenues, and receipts of the City;

1 (3) shall conduct biennial audits of principal agencies, as provided in § 11 of this
2 article;

3 (4) may audit the expenditure of City-granted funds by any public or private agency
4 that receives such funds;

5 (5) may audit City contracts, grants, subgrants and other agreements as required by
6 the terms and conditions of these instruments and, when the contracts, grants,
7 subgrants and other agreements require that audits be conducted by other auditors,
8 review such audits; and

9 (6) shall make such other audits as the Comptroller or the Board of Estimates may
10 request, provided that those requested audits do not, in the judgment of the City
11 Auditor, unduly hinder the performance of regular audits.

12 (B) *SUBPOENA.*

13 (1) TO PERFORM THE DUTIES OF HIS OR HER OFFICE, THE CITY AUDITOR MAY ISSUE A
14 SUBPOENA TO ANY MUNICIPAL OFFICER, MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEE, OR ANY OTHER
15 PERSON RECEIVING CITY FUNDS TO REQUIRE THE PRODUCTION OF ANY INFORMATION,
16 DOCUMENT, REPORT, RECORD, ACCOUNT, OR OTHER MATERIAL.

17 (2) THE CITY AUDITOR MAY ENFORCE ANY SUBPOENA ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS
18 SUBSECTION IN ANY COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION.

19 (C) [(b)] *Reports.*

20 The City Auditor shall make reports of all such audits to the Comptroller and, at the same
21 time, to each of the other members of the Board of Estimates.

22 **§ 11. Department of Audits – Biennial audits of principal agencies.**

23 (e) *Publication of reports.*

24 Reports of all audits conducted under this section shall be:

25 (1) posted on a public website maintained by the City Comptroller;

26 (2) filed with the Department of Legislative Reference; [and]

27 (3) SUBMITTED TO THE PRINCIPAL AGENCY AUDITED; AND

28 (4) [(3)] submitted to each member of:

29 (i) the Board of Estimates;


30 (ii) the City Council;

31 (iii) the Biennial Audits Oversight Commission.

2 Charter be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City, for adoption or rejection,
3 in accordance with Article XI-A, § 5 of the Maryland Constitution, in the form specified by the
4 City Solicitor.
