#### **NOTES**

- The Chair began by introducing the resolution and its sponsor, Councilwoman Ramos
- Councilwoman Ramos gave some opening remarks on the Water-for-All program
  - Created to ensure that more people had access to a water usage discount
  - Expands access to renters
  - Some delays in implementing the program
  - O This hearing serves to understand how it is going and examine how we can improve
    - Including how to get more people enrolled
  - Invited a constituent to speak briefly
    - Indicated that the program's implementation has been horrendous
    - The constituent expressed major frustrations with the programs

- MOCFS discussed the program's history and information on how discounts/checks are calculated
- The Chair asked whether there was a method to how marketing calls are made
  - o MOCFS it is not targeted, based off a list
- DPW discussed some data surrounding applicants
  - o The Chair noted that the program seemingly serves a large group of younger people
- The Chair inquired on how many employees were working on the program
  - o The agencies estimated about 10
- Councilman Gray asked why median household size fluctuated between 1-2; why weren't families bigger?
  - o DPW Lots of applicants are single
  - o Gray based on the age ranges identified, seems that these are low
- Councilman Gray also asked why fewer credits were given but at a higher value were the same amount of people being helped
  - o MOCFS BH20 was an automatic enrollment vs. income based W4A
  - o Is there anything in place to help those now denied folks?
  - o DPW the Tier system (in slides) should lead to an increase
- Vice Chair Glover asked whether there is any sort of narrative/qualitative data on the program
  - o Are there any stories, focus groups, etc.
  - o DPW we have not yet begun to collect that sort of data because of how fast we had to stand up the program
    - Lots of people are looking to lower arrears
- Vice Chair Glover also asked whether there are any partnerships to educate individuals in need
  - o DPW did not highlight any partnerships but did discuss information that its representatives could share
  - o MOCFS strong focus on casework and they do try to direct to other city agencies/options
- Councilwoman Ramos thanked those representatives in attendance
  - o There could be a marketing opportunity in schools
  - Asked what BH20 threshold and credit was
    - Credit was 43% of a bill and bay restoration fees were not applied, the eligibility was at or below 175% federal poverty guidelines were eligible
      - Additional support for customers at or below 50% of the federal poverty guidelines
  - How was it automatic if income based
    - DPW Sent from state of Maryland
  - o Asked whether water for all removed any stormwater or bay water restoration fees?
    - DPW correct
- Councilman Jones identified a potential gap when people engage with the program, they are already in arrears
  - We should work to anticipate people who sign up with existing deficits
  - o DPW Code does allow for the department to create a program to assist but would need to determine how best to stand up that sort of program
  - o Councilwoman Ramos suggests that the water affordability and equity act suggests that the same amount should be reduced from those individual's debt
- Public Testimony was generally supportive and encourages auto-enrollment effort
