Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Rat Infestation: The hearing centered around citywide rat abatement efforts, with an emphasis on how Baltimore has become one of the top 10 cities in the U.S. for rat infestations. The issue was framed as a significant public health threat impacting residents' living conditions, particularly in vulnerable neighborhoods.
- 2. Sanitation and Trash Disposal: The discussion highlighted the critical role of proper sanitation and trash disposal in controlling the rat population. Improper waste management, both by residents and businesses, was identified as a major contributor to rat infestations.
- 3. Inter-agency Collaboration: The need for collaboration between different city agencies (Health Department, DPW, and DHCD) was emphasized, with a focus on how coordinated efforts could improve rat abatement strategies. CleanStat meetings were mentioned as an avenue for this collaboration.
- 4. Public Awareness and Engagement: There was a significant call for increased community engagement and public awareness campaigns to educate residents about proper waste disposal and sanitation practices.

- 1. Data Requests: Councilwoman McCray requested an overlay map showing the top 10 areas with dirty alley requests and rat-related complaints over the last 60 days.
- 2. Rat Birth Control Inquiry: Councilwoman Porter inquired about the use of contrapest (rat birth control) and requested an update within a week regarding the city's progress in exploring this solution.
- 3. Budget Details: Both Councilwomen McCray and Porter requested information on the budgets allocated for rat abatement, community engagement, and public awareness campaigns.
- 4. Public Awareness Campaign: There was a strong request for a comprehensive public awareness campaign on trash disposal and sanitation practices, with a focus on utilizing various media platforms to reach residents.
- 5. Inquiry on Citations to Businesses: Councilwoman Porter raised a question about how many citations have been issued to local businesses for sanitation and cleanliness violations, particularly in relation to rat infestations.
- 6. Vacant Building Data: Councilman James Torrence requested a follow-up to improve coordination on addressing rat infestations in vacant properties and proposed changes to the consent process for rat abatement on private properties.
