Councilwoman Odette Ramos

NOTES

- Chair Conway opened the hearing with some opening remarks and introductions
- Councilwoman Ramos gave some opening remarks discussing the bill
 - o Requires that the fire chief create an emergency scene around an emergency with whatever barricade/tape necessary and limits who is permitted within that scene
 - o Bill discusses what a scene is and who is allowed in
 - Also sets forth penalties for violations
 - o The bill does not permit anyone from speaking with residents outside of the boundaries
- Councilwoman Ramos discussed circulated amendments in the context of the unofficial reprint

- o Caution tape changed to barricade so that the fire chief in charge can use whatever materials are at their disposal
- o Barricades will stay up so long as keeping them up does not prevent a public safety hazard
- New list of authorized persons to integrate Fire Department Personnel under one subheading
 - Also creates a definition for community or volunteer nonprofit association to assist individuals amidst a disaster
- O Sets penalties as a misdemeanor but changes to make penalties the same as those for crossing a crime scene
 - Police use disorderly conduct/disobeying the order of an officer to penalize and the amendments point to that
- o Finally, administration wanted this to take effect immediately
- Councilwoman Ramos also discussed those amendments offered by those in opposition
 - o The amendments were duplicative with the ethics code
 - o Not interested in having the fire department give passes to specific organizations
- Councilman Schleifer asked that CM Ramos elaborate on how the Fire Department can bring charges
 - o City law department responds that the bill must have its own penalties
 - In this particular law it sets the same penalties as in the other law
 - Fire department would notify the police that a crime has been committed
 - Then it is up to the state's attorney on whether to charge
 - o Councilwoman Ramos clarifies that this bill makes clear who is responsible for what
 - o It is within the fire chief's discretion on who can be authorized to enter, like a police line
- Councilman Blanchard asked a question about licensing and why that was not included
 - o Councilwoman Ramos indicated that the Fire Department is under an ethics law and was concerned with determining what organizations would and would not be authorized
 - And it is a safety concern
- Councilman Glover asked whether restoration companies can speak with the chief to identify themselves and request to speak with families
 - o Fire department indicates that the bill solidifies that they will not need to speak with outside companies until the incident is mitigated
 - o People will be excluded based on their duties
 - O Asked what the harm would be with a company speaking with a relative outside of the barricaded area
 - O Councilwoman Ramos indicates that the bill gives the chief the authority to set up a scene to determine who can enter a scene vs. who cannot
 - After the fire is no longer a danger and the chief deems it safe, anyone can go wherever they want
 - Recognizes it can be helpful to have people assist victims of fire
 - Have worked with DHCD to establish a victims and crisis services unit to assist victims of fire
 - Solely prevents restoration companies (and related) from being in the middle of an active scene
- Councilwoman McCray asked whether the purpose of the bill was to solely establish penalties
 - o Councilwoman Ramos indicates that it allows the fire department to set up a scene but also creates penalties for individuals who continue to cross the scene

- Councilman Schleifer indicated that he supports the intent but expressed concern over those who *may* be allowed onto a scene and suggested that it creates more confusing discretions
 - o Suggests that BGE may be concerned to turn off gas because of potential penalties
 - o Should be more clear about who is and who is not allowed
- Motion to move amendments favorably by Blanchard
 - o Ayes have it
- Councilman Schleifer asked about amending further on clarifying on who may be allowed
- Councilwoman Ramos indicated that she was willing to work on something in second reader
- Councilman Blanchard comments that the bill allows the chief to authorize who can be on the scene
 - Knowing how fluid these circumstances are, we should allow the chiefs to have this discretion
 - Chiefs/scene commanders may not know the entire city code and becoming more specific may cause confusion
 - o Mr. Schnella suggests that the bill in its current form is supported by the administration, but the administration does not support mandating who can and cannot enter
 - Want to ensure the fire chief can control their scene for safety reasons
- Motion to recommend the bill favorably by Blanchard
 - o Bill was recommended favorably with amendments
