## **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Councilmember Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and read the bill into the record.
- 2. Councilmember Porter commented about the purpose of the bill. She expressed the need for partnership solutions to address vacant building problems. She emphasized that property owners are not being targeted for not being able to secure leases for their properties. She would like properties around the City to be maintained in good condition. Incentivizing property owners so that buildings do not become vacant is important. She will follow-up with DHCD to improve handling of non-residential vacant properties.
- 3. Chris Ryer presented the Planning Commission's report which supports the bill.
- 4. Alice Kennedy emphasized the impact vacant buildings (residential and non-residential) have on communities. Commercial corridors are vital to communities. Key to achieving success is partnerships both public and private. One of the major priorities is putting property back into use. The Department of Housing and Community Development works with Baltimore Development Corporation to address vacant property issues. Some properties are unoccupied, not vacant. DHCD works to provide resources to help unoccupied properties become productive. Vacant Building Notices can authorize special actions.
- 5. Councilman Stokes shared information about establishment of a Blight Taskforce which would assess vacant properties and enforce violations. The Taskforce would work with other agencies to determine causes for vacancies.
- 6. Councilmember Ramos spoke about lowering the threshold for Vacant Building Notices. Monetize the designation. She indicated interest in registering empty store front properties in Residential Business Licensing Districts.
- 7. Councilmember Conway wanted to know if there is an alert system to identify vacant buildings. There is not an alert system. Baltimore has a mandatory registration for non-owner-occupied properties.

- 8. Councilmember Dorsey wanted to know whether photos submitted with 3-1-1 complaints are reviewed. Inspectors review photos. There does not seem to be a time-sensitive follow-up protocol for Vacant Building Notices. According to DHCD, over the last two years a policy change has occurred which would allow for the issuance of a Failure to Abate Notice. Inspector bandwidths (number of inspectors available) determines follow-up. Currently there are 50 inspectors. Permitting is important.
- 9. Dan Taylor discussed programs aimed at incentivizing cooperative property owners.
- 10. Agency representatives provided reports for their respective agencies.
- 11. The committee opened the hearing for public testimony.
- 12. Peter Duvall testified about the boarding of vacant properties.
- 13. Debbie Dickerson is concerned about nuisance vacant properties in her area.
- 14. Scott Kashnow testified in support of the bill and the need for an early warning alert system for vacant properties.
- 15. Brittany Banks testified in support of the bill. Property owners should be held accountable for vacant property.
- 16. Tracy O'Neill supports the bill and would like to hold commercial property owners accountable for vacant buildings.
- 17. Nicole testified about the permitting process.
- 18. The committee approved a motion to recommend the bill favorably.
- 19. The hearing was adjourned.
