19	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the

1	§ 9-119. Enforcement.
2	(a) Noncompliance cause for cancellation.
3	Failure to comply with the requirements set by or under authority of this title:
4 5	(1) CONSTITUTES A VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE, SUBJECT TO THE ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS AND PENALTIES APPLICABLE TO VIOLATIONS OF THIS ARTICLE; AND
6 7	(2) is cause for canceling ALL OR PART OF the Planned Unit Development and Development Plan.
8	(b) Notice.
9 10	The Zoning Administrator must provide the owner or developer at least 15 days' notice to appear before the Zoning Administrator and answer to any charge of noncompliance.
11	(c) Action by Administrator.
12 13 14	If the Zoning Administrator finds the charges to be substantiated, and if the situation is not satisfactorily adjusted within a specified period set by the Zoning Administrator, the Zoning Administrator may:
15 16	(1) order cancellation of ALL OR PART OF the Planned Unit Development and Development Plan; and
17	(2) take any other action that is appropriate.

20	§ 17-201. Who may appeal.
21 22 23	A decision of the Zoning Administrator, including the issuance a violation notice under Subtitle 1 of this title, or the failure of the Zoning Administrator to act within a timely manner, may be appealed to the Board by:
24	(1) any person aggrieved by the decision OR FAILURE TO ACT; or
25 26	(2) any officer, department, board, or bureau of the City affected by the decision OR FAILURE TO ACT.
27	§ 17-202. When and how taken.
28	(a) When taken.
29	The notice of appeal must be filed as follows:
30 31	(1) in the case of a violation notice, within 10 working days of the date the notice was served; and

1 2	(2) in the case of any other decision, within 10 working days of the date on which notice of the decision was given.
3	§ 17-204. Decision of Board.
4	(a) Board to issue.
5 6	Without unreasonable delay, the Board must render its decision in writing, setting forth its findings of fact and conclusions of law.
7	(b) Board powers.
8	(1) In exercising its powers of review, the Board:
9 10	(i) may reverse or affirm, wholly or in part, or modify the decision appealed from;
11	(II) IN THE CASE OF AN APPEAL FROM A FAILURE TO ACT:
12 13	(A) MAY ORDER THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR TO TAKE IMMEDIATE ACTION ON THE MATTER IN DISPUTE; OR
14 15	(B) may hear and decide the matter in dispute on its own initiative; and
16 17	(III) [(ii)] may make any order, requirement, decision, or determination as ought to be made.
18 19	(2) For these purposes, the Board has all the powers conferred by this article on the Zoning Administrator.
20 21 22	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
23 24	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
