
Re: City Council Bill 14-0399 – Tax Credits – Historic Properties –

Dear President and City Council Members:

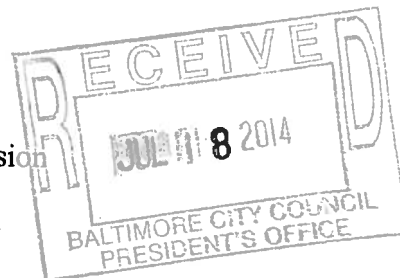
The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 14-0399 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill revises Section 10-8 of Article 28 of the Baltimore City Code on the tax credit for historic properties to be consistent with the state enabling law, which was recently changed. See 2014 Md. Laws, Ch. 193. Specifically, it clarifies the manner in which the tax credit will be calculated and allows for that calculation to be based on an appraisal of the property after October 1, 2014.
