#### **BACKGROUND**

#### **Bill Summary**

This bill authorizes the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to release and terminate the City's interest in a 30-foot-wide vehicular access easement located along the eastern

boundary of 6709 Pulaski Highway. This easement was originally granted to the City in 2011 to allow access from Pulaski Highway to a separate City-owned parcel.

The bill permits the Comptroller to execute and deliver a deed of release and surrender to the property owner, formally extinguishing the easement. No release may proceed without approval from the City Solicitor.

22	WHEREAS, by the Access Easement, the City of Baltimore was granted the right to vehicular
23	access over the Easement Area to access a different parcel of land owned by the City of
24	Baltimore.
25	WHEREAS, the City of Baltimore does not have the legal right to cross the railroad tracks
26	between the Property and the parcel owned by the City of Baltimore and the determination that
27	the cost of grading the Easement Area and constructing a road thereon if the City of Baltimore
28	were to be able to obtain the right to cross the railroad tracks would be prohibitively expensive
29	and impractical.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, because the Access Easement has never been used for public use and cannot practically be used in the future, the City of Baltimore has determined that the Access Easement should be released of record and terminated.
4 5	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Comptroller of Baltimore City be and is hereby authorized on behalf of the Mayor and City
6	Council of Baltimore to execute and deliver unto the owner or owners of the Property, a release, termination, and surrender of all the interest of the City of Baltimore in the Access Easement and
8	the Easement Area.
9	The Easement Area is generally described as a thirty foot wide parcel, which extends from
10	Pulaski Highway on the north to the southern boundary of Block 6235, Lots 009 and 009A, and

- Pulaski Highway on the north to the southern boundary of Block 6235, Lots 009 and 009A, and along the entire eastern boundary of Block 6235, Lots 009 and 009A.
- The use of the Access Easement and the Easement Area described hereinabove is no longer 12 needed for public purposes and has not been used for public purposes. 13
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance 14 unless the deed, release, and surrender has been approved by the City Solicitor. 15
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is 16 17 enacted.

#### **BILL SYNOPSIS**

Council Bill 25-0049 would release an Easement located in the property known as 6709 Pulaski Highway. The Easement is generally described as a 30-foot-wide parcel extending from Pulaski Highway on the north to the southern boundary of the Property along the entire eastern boundary of the Property. The Easement connects Pulaski Highway to an undeveloped City-Owned parcel behind the property.

The Easement was originally granted as part of an agreement dated October 7, 2011, when the City sold the Property to WH-Pulaski, LLC., for just over \$1M. The Property was previously the site of the Pulaski Incinerator. The Property is now owned by 6709 Pulaski, LLC., and is in use as in industrial warehouse.

#### **SUMMARY OF POSITION**

This Easement cannot be practically used by the City, and so its release is recommended. First and foremost, the City would have to acquire the right to cross the railroad tracks between the Property and the City-owned Parcel by the railroad owner. Furthermore, the cost of grading and building a road on the Easement would be prohibitively high. For these reasons, the Department respectfully requests a <u>favorable</u> bill report.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The Department projects no fiscal impacts as a result of the proposed legislation.
