AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Baltimore City Landmark List – Waverly Town Hall

FOR the purpose of designating Waverly Town Hall, 3100 Greenmount Avenue (Block 3881, Lot 10/12), as a historical landmark.

BY adding

Article 6 - Historical and Architectural Preservation

Section(s) 13-1, to be under the new subtitle “Subtitle 13. Landmark List - 2010s”

Baltimore City Code

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation

SUBTITLE 13. LANDMARK LIST - 2010S

§ 13-1. WAVERLY TOWN HALL.

WAVERLY TOWN HALL, 3100 GREENMOUNT AVENUE (BLOCK 3881, LOT 10/12).

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
