### Informational Hearing - Safekeeping and Storage of Baltimore City Wills

FOR the purpose of inviting the Register of Wills, the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore City, the Chief Judge of the Circuit Court for Baltimore City, the Director of the Department of General Services, and the City Administrator to appear before the City Council to discuss the current space allocated to store wills in the Clarence J. Mitchell, Jr. Courthouse, the lack of fire and flood protection in said storage space, and the need to digitize and protect the 100 years of wills being stored in a room in the aging courthouse.

9 Recitals

Pursuant to § 2-208 {"Powers and duties of register"} of the Estates and Trusts Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the Register of Wills "shall receive, file, and store safely every original paper and record left in the register's custody, in a repository of the courthouse as the court may direct". Further, § 2-208 states that "[t]he County Commissioners, County Council, or the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall provide and keep in repair the repository at its expense".

The Register of Wills is currently unable to securely store documents filed with the Court due to inadequate storage space. The Courthouse also lacks fire and flood protection, putting wills dating back to 100 years ago and other historical documents at risk.

Currently, Baltimore City is the only large jurisdiction in the State of Maryland that does not provide a fire resistant and water resistant repository for original Last Will and Testaments. To properly secure these vital documents, the Register of Wills needs proper historical space to serve the residents of Baltimore City and fulfill their statutory duties.
