16	§ 10-801. Authority to impound.
17	An animal enforcement officer, police officer, humane officer, or other person authorized and
18	contracting with the City to do so may impound any animal:
19	(1) found at large;
20	(2) whose owner or custodian does not have the required license or permit for the animal;
21	(3) that is found without a license tag required by this title;
