enforce Baltimore City's commercial vehicle monitoring system.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Article 31. Transit and Traffic

Subtitle 34. Commercial Vehicle Monitoring System

§ 34-3. Governing standards, etc.

(b) *Maximum number of operational cameras.*


No more than [6] 16 cameras may be operational at any one time.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day
after the date it is enacted.
