History of Syringe Services in Baltimore City

- 1994- started out with 2 mobile units/4 unique sites
- 2004- operated 2 mobile units/12
- 2014- operated 2 mobile units/21
- 2015- Moved to distribution model
- 2016-Statewide Expansion Legislation
- 2019-CBOs approved for SSP in Baltimore City






Syringe Services Programs

Expansion Legislation- 2016

- S.B. 97, 436 Maryland General Assembly, 436 Session (Md. 2016).
- BCHD SSP only operating program in Maryland for 24 years [1994-2018]
 - Comprehensive services offered
- 9 other jurisdictions now operating SSPs
- 3 other jurisdictions currently in planning phase






Difference in Laws

Baltimore City

- Confidential [name-based]
- Operated by LHD
- Criminal liability- immunity does not extend to:
 - Secondary exchange
 - Activities not authorized by LHD
 - Possession outside of COB

Statewide


- Anonymous [unique identifier]
- May be operated by LHDs or CBOs [State & local approval needed]
- Criminal liability- immunity extends to:
 - Secondary exchange
 - Activities not authorized by LHD
 - Possession outside of specified operating jurisdiction





Role of the Baltimore City Health Department and Syringe Service Program


- Program Consultation

- Collaboration and Partnerships















What Changed


- SSP Expansion-Statewide
