Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilman Burnett, primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks. Some highlighted remarks were:
 - Concern/goal

 to have moving completed in a timely manner
 - Concern need to know the duties/responsibilities of each agency
 - Intent to create a workgroup
 - The purpose of the Resolution is to continue the conversation about this issue
- 2. The City Administrator talked about the ways his Office is working to address this issue. Some highlighted remarks were:
 - There are five (5) city agencies responsible for this task
 - Talked about the role of Clean Stat
 - Talked about what is expected of each agency
 - Does not believe the responsibilities should be assigned to just one city agency
 - There may be unintended consequences if responsibilities are placed under just one agency
 - Office is already working on improving ground maintenance
 - Is concerned about a lack of coordination and his quest is making sure agencies are working together
- 3. Several committee members asked the City Administrator questions and gave remarks/comments. Some highlights from same were:

• Questions/Concerns/Comments

- o Have any assessments been done on the cost analysis for having 1 agency perform the duties versus having multiple agencies?
- Concern: Five agencies responsible for 5 separate contracts! Is this a common practice in other cities? (Best practice)
- O How do we (agencies) prepare the cutting schedules at the start of the season?
- o Concern: Need to know why we don't have a cutting schedule!
- Comment: Need to be pro-active!
- What are the current rates that we (city) pay our vendors?
 - Requested by: <u>Councilman Torrence</u>: Provide the rates paid to the vendors, and
 - Provide updated information regarding Clean Stat
- How are you enforcing and making sure the privately-owned properties are being mowed?
- Responsibility of Agencies is of concern:
 - Who is responsible for what?

Has any discussion been done regarding the role and/or responsibilities of each agency?

o 311 Reports/Complaints/Citations

- Do we (agencies) pull those reports to address the overgrown sites?
- What is the timeline (benchmark) for addressing these issues?
 - Requested by <u>Councilwoman Porter</u>: Submit a follow-up report before years' end regarding the timelines implemented
- What is the timeline used to follow-up once a citation(s) is issued?

• Suggestion(s):

- o Land Development Contractors
 - When the contractors are developing properties, they should be responsible for cutting grass on those properties instead of city agencies
- Procurement
 - o Concern different contract awards and/or no standard rate
 - o Is there one solicitation for that bid?
- Communication
 - o One very important thing is missing, "lack of communication between agencies"
 - o Better communication is needed
 - o Educating the public there is a lack in educating the public about which agency does what!
- Comments:
 - o There seems like there are too many "cooks in the kitchen"
 - o There seems to be a lot of confusions that falls on the councilmembers (constituents' concerns on this issue)
- Quality Control is of concern
 - o Contractor(s) doing inadequate work
 - Is there any follow-up by the agencies on the contractors' performance?
- Agencies
- o Is any conversation being held by the agencies for "pro-active mowing?"
 - Requested by <u>Councilman Burnett</u>: Provide the number of lots each agency is responsible for
- 4. The agency representatives talked about his/her report and/or some of their responsibilities. Some highlighted remarks were:
 - Per the Department of Transportation
 - o There are over 500 locations that the Department is responsible for mowing
 - Per the Department of Public Works
 - o The Department can receive up to 4,000 request per month for mowing
 - o Works closely with other city agencies

- Talked about data/statistics regarding mowing and cleaning requests
- Per the Department of Finance
 - o The report they submitted summarizes the functions of each agency
 - There are different requirements in each agency
 - Having separate agencies to complete the responsibilities appears to be the best process; using one agency may have unintended consequences
 - Have not completed a detailed analysis for this issue but will do so as part of a working group
