Dear President and City Council Members:


The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 12-0072 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill amends Ordinance 11-459 to reflect the lot consolidation that occurred after the ordinance was enacted. It amends the property address of the housing for the elderly, formerly known as 4309-4311 Pimlico Road, to 4311 Pimlico Road.

Pursuant to the City Zoning Code, a bill concerning a conditional use is classified as a "legislative authorization." ZC § 16-101. Legislative authorizations require that certain procedures be followed in the bill's passage. Specifically, certain notice requirements apply to the introduction of the bill. See ZC § 16-203. The bill must be referred to certain City agencies, which are obligated to review the bill in a specified manner. See ZC §§ 16-301, 16-302 & 16-304. Additional public notice and hearing requirements also apply to the bill. See ZC § 16-402. Finally, certain limitations on the City Council's ability to amend the bill apply. See ZC § 16-403. Assuming all the procedural requirements are met, the Law Department will approve the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
